- 4. What studies are planned or possible to improve the understanding of the socio-economic significance of the SLO County marine resources?

- 1. How do you establish the economic value of a beach?
- 2. How do factors like water quality impact these calculations?
- 3. What are the plans to analyze these issues for the SLO County beaches?
